Reasons of theme-selection:		
<p>This is a foundation course to the field of intelligence studies that develops students' awareness of the application of generally accepted intelligence disciplines to customary intelligence activities conducted within the intelligence cycle commonly used by most countries with a developed national security framework. By the end of this course, students will be able to describe the intelligence disciplines, understand intelligence activities, and apply the intelligence cycle. The course will emphasize knowledge, concepts, and principles, and the significance of collection, analysis, counterintelligence, and covert action.</p> <p>Having established an understanding of the study of intelligence and comparative global approaches to intelligence via lecture, seminar participants will present their studies to the class.</p>
